- CULTURAL TOUR -Newgrange Tumulus World Heritage Site



Farmleigh\* is an estate situated in Dublin's Phoenix Park, and provides accommodation for visiting dignitaries and guests of the nation. A historic house, it holds important collections, an art gallery, farm animals, and the official Irish State Guest House.

Home to the Guinness family for generations, Farmleigh remains a unique representation of the Edwardian period, and houses important artworks and furnishings, as well as the Benjamin Iveagh collection of rare books, bindings, and manuscripts.

The extensive grounds feature walled and sunken gardens and scenic lakeside walks. Join one of the knowledgeable guides for a tour of Farmleigh House that takes you from the eighteenth century right up to the present day.

\*Farmleigh has been the home of the WCSI Annual Exhibition for some years and will provide opportunities for our guests to visit the Society's Annual Exhibition 2023, and provide the location for the Symposium Master Classes, Workshops, and Art Materials Arcade.

There will be twice-daily transport (and return) between the City Centre and Farmleigh. Here our visitors will enjoy the environment of the beautiful Grand House and Park, and it's herd of deer wandering freely through the landscape. A restaurant offers good fare for lunch, or coffee/ tea-break. There are picturesque views over the lake and throughout the Park

## - PRESIDENTS'MEETING: THE IRISH ARCHITECTURAL ARCHIVE -The City Assembly House, 45 Merrion Square, Dublin 2.

The Irish Architectural Archive was established in 1976 to collect and preserve material of every kind relating to the architecture of the entire island of Ireland, and make it available to the public. As a cumulative body of material the holdings of the Archive represent the greatest single source of information on Ireland's buildings and those who designed them.

The Irish Architectural Archive Architecture Gallery and first floor rooms are open from 10 am to 5 pm, Monday to Friday. Access is free.

Newgrange is a Stone Age (Neolithic) monument in the Boyne Valley, County Meath, it is a 5,200 year old passage tomb located in the Boyne Valley it is the jewel in the crown in Ireland's Ancient East. Constructed about 3,200 B.C. it is older than Stonehenge and the Great Pyramids of Giza.


Newgrange is a large circular mound 85m in diameter and 13m high with a 19m stone passageway and chambers inside. The mound is ringed by 97 large kerbstones, some of which are engraved with symbols called megalithic art. The passage and chamber are aligned with the rising sun on the mornings around the Winter Solstice.


Archaeologists classified Newgrange as a Passage Tomb, however Newgrange is now recognised to be much more than that. 'Ancient Temple' is a more fitting classification, a place of astrological, spiritual, religious and ceremonial importance, much as present day cathedrals are places of prestige and worship where dignitaries may be laid to

Numbers allowed access to the Monument are strictly limited. We are fortunate to have been granted access on Monday 9th and Tuesday 10th October 2023, 9.45am depart. Arrival at Bru Na Boinne: 11.00am. Duration of visit: 3 Hours. Lunch locally at 14.20 approx. Expected return time to Dublin city: 15.30.

A coach will take our guests from the city centre to the site of our guided tour. After our site visit we will have lunch locally, before returning to Dublin for approximately 1.30pm.





#### GALA BUFFET - ARLINGTON HOTEL DUBLIN

The Gala Buffet at The Arlington Hotel (close to O'Connell Bridge) will allow visitors a stroll to the venue from their arrival in the city. We will meet informally at the venue for 7.00 - 7.30pm where we will dine buffet-style at 8pm in an ambiance with the focus on our Irish traditions.

The music will be as Irish as the meal and will feature some essential tunes from our traditions. The Uilleann Pipes are just one of a variety of native instruments played by the resident quartet of musicians. A staging of some Irish Dancing might prompt you to join the dancers.
